I have been a governor at Tower Hill Primary School since my eldest son started in Year R – and he is now in Year 6! It has been quite the journey particularly in the last few years, and


there was a very steep learning curve at the beginning with many new acronyms to learn.

approach to learning - supporting the ethos of the school that ALL children can achieve at a high level. We saw children being challenged and supported to develop their number skills through this approach and it was a delight to see them thriving

and confident to tell us what they were doing.

## **Other Visits**



In addition, we perform 'monitoring' visits throughout the year, ranging from financial checks such as payroll and petty cash, health and safety tours, fire safety checks, site tours, IT Asset checks and even a visit to Foxes' Hollow.

The reason for these visits is to provide accountability for the school to ensure it is performing in the right way, and to be that 'critical friend' to support the leadership of the school.

## Sports Premium

Another area of focus for the Governing Body is to ensure the additional funding the school receives for investment in Sport and something called Pupil Premium – additional funding to support those children that need it most - is spent well. Swimming lessons, bikeability, as well as training for teachers to better teach sport to the children is funded using this Sport and Pupil Premium. The recent successes in Dance competitions and Football can be directly tracked to the approval for the funding spent on these areas.
