Marvellous Me

Sharing our favourite Nursery rhymes, songs and stories with others Learn and perform new Nursery rhymes Learn about rhyme

Sharing our own firework experiences Making fireworks out of junk Creating firework pictures with chalk, paint and cotton buds

Explore different instruments and try to make firework sounds



Its Christmas

Our role play area will be Santa's Grotto and we can pretend to be Santa, elves or reindeer with our friends Make a Christmas card for our family

Sequence the Christmas story



Practise and perform our Christmas Nativity to our family and friends

Learn lots of Christmas songs

Literacy

Learn our letter sounds through daily phonics lessons Recognise our names in the classroom Explore mark making on paper, in the sand, with paint Develop our fine motor (small movements with our hands and fingers) through a variety of activities Practise writing our names using the correct letter formation Start to write simple words using the initial sound Label pictures Share picture books and tell stories with our teachers and friends Start to sound out short words using the sounds we have learnt Learn to read and spell some 'Red' words

Maths

Learn the Days of the Week song and take part in Calendar Maths each day Daily counting activities - counting out loud, counting objects and sounds Understand the composition of the numbers 0-10 Practise writing numbers using the correct formation Recognise 2d shapes and create pictures Make repeating patterns

Physical Development

Explore the outside areas Create obstacle courses with a variety of equipment Learn to use bats and balls with our friends Use the Parachute in PE lessons Start to explore the indoor equipment during indoor PE sessions

Practise climbing, balancing, running and jumping using the space safely and appropriately

At Home you can:
